

Prescott National Forest Outlook/Conditions

Key Points Current drought status: Near to below average precipitation in March has allowed severe to exceptional drought conditions to continue across northern Arizona. Fuel Conditions: Energy Release Component (ERC): ERCs are generally near average for this time of year. Temperature and Precipitation Outlooks: April - Odds favor drier than average conditions near the Arizona/Utah border. Otherwise, equal chances exist for above, near, or below normal precipitation across the rest of the state. Odds favor warmer than average conditions across Arizona. April through June - Odds will continue to favor drier than average conditions near the Arizona/Utah border. Otherwise, equal chances exist for above, near, or below normal precipitation across the rest of the state. Odds favor warmer than average conditions across Arizona. July through September – The extended outlook favors above normal temperatures, with odds tilted in favor of a wetter than average monsoon season across Arizona. Significant Wildland Fire Potential Outlook: Above normal fire threats look to develop at lower elevations (SE AZ into Yavapai County) in April, with above normal fire threat spreading north across all of Arizona by May and June. With wetter than average conditions favored by Mid July, the significant wildland fire potential should normalize by then. NWS Flagstaff Drought Monitor Comparison 2021 (Current) 2020 Comparing the latest drought monitor to the one from this time last year shows how drought conditions worsened across Arizona. Currently 100% of the entire state is in a drought, as opposed to 24% of the state this time last vear.

Last year Jerome Fire Department wildland crew had 3 off district assignments, they were in Arizona, Utah and California. So far this year in March we accepted an assignment to Texas. Since our wildland crew has been back, we've had requests for different assignments in New Mexico, the Crooked fire in Prescott and the Tunnel fire in Flagstaff. However, we did not accept any of the assignments due to vehicle maintenance and our crews needing wildland refresher and pack test, which were done April 21, 2022. Crews will be available to go back out after April 22, 2022. Jerome fire is expecting once again a very active wildlands season.

File of Life and "Rescue Pet" Stickers

We have magnetic **Files of Life** cards available at the fire station that help first responders contact the right person(s) in the event of an emergency. These must be placed on the refrigerator so we can easily find the information. *Only the person(s) listed on these cards can be contacted by the Fire Department in case of an emergency.*



We also have "Rescue Pet" stickers used to alert first responders of pets in the house. These stickers should be placed on or near the front door. This alerts firefighters of potential rescues inside the building and lets EMTs know what pets to care for or keep inside if the house is left unattended. The Jerome Fire Department is doing everything they need to be doing to protect their first responders and the public. Know that we are here to serve you in the event of any emergency.

JEROME HISTORICAL SOCIETY LOANS PAINTING TO PHOENIX ART MUSEUM

This past winter the Jerome Historical Society was privileged to loan a painting from its collection, "Miner Pushing Ore Cart" by William D. White to the Phoenix Museum of Art for an exhibition called "Landscapes of Extraction," which explored the art, artistry, and impact of mining on the American West.

You can see this painting in the Jerome Mine Museum on Main Street. It was part of a series commissioned in the mid-1930's by Phelps Dodge Corporation, which owned the mines in Jerome at that time. White, an artist from Delaware, had been commissioned by Phelps Dodge to paint images illustrating various aspects of hard rock mining and of the miners themselves.



Two other paintings by a Jerome-born artist, Lew Davis (born 1910), were also hung in the museum gallery on each side of the "Miner Pushing Ore Cart." "Morning at the Little Daisy," depicting miners gathering at the mine headframe waiting to go down into the mine, is owned by the Phoenix Art Museum. "Little Boy Lives in a Copper Camp," is a poignant portrait of a young boy sitting beside a window overlooking the dry and barren hills surrounding the mining town. Both of these paintings were funded through federal support from the Works Progress Administration (WPA) in the mid-1930's.

The "Landscapes of Extraction" exhibition closed on March 6, 2022, and "Miner Pushing Ore Cart" is once again at home and on view in the Mine Museum on Main Street in Jerome.

HOW IS OUR PAID PARKING SYSTEM DOING?

Jerome established a pay-to-park system a few years ago that has served the town well. Here's a statement of income and expenses covering the 22-month period from July 1, 2020 and April 30, 2022:

During this period, the parking fund has transferred \$183,791 to our utilities and HURF funds to help finance needed work on our springs, maintenance and replacement of water and sewer lines, street repairs, and ongoing work on the public restrooms planned for First Avenue, which we anticipate will be complete by the end of summer. We anticipate even greater transfers in future years.

There had initially been some concern that paid parking would hurt our businesses and deplete our sales tax revenue, but that has not proven to be the case. In fact, during this period, sales tax revenues have substantially *increased*. During fiscal year 2019, the average monthly sales tax revenue was \$85,559. During fiscal year 2020, when the impact of COVID was felt, the average monthly sales tax revenue dropped slightly to \$78,281. In fiscal year 2021, that figure bounced back to \$99,442, and during the first nine months of fiscal year 2022, the monthly average sales tax revenue has been a healthy \$117,448 ... and that does not include April, May and June, typically some of our strongest months.

All in all, our paid parking program has been a tremendous success and an asset for Jerome.
