Obituary for Daniel Vladich Jr

Daniel Vladich Jr, always known as "Danny", passed away in Camp Verde, AZ on September 25, 2022 - 2 months shy of his 84th birthday, while recovering from a fall and receiving therapy after his hip fracture surgery. Danny was born in Jerome in 1938 where he grew up until the mine closed. His family was transferred to Ajo, Az where he continued his education. After high school, he was employed by the Phelps Dodge Company until he was inducted into the US Army. He proudly served 2 years while stationed in Germany and was active in the reserves for 4 years. Upon his discharge, he continued to work for the company for a total of 12 years as a locomotive engineer. He returned to Jerome to help his parents when his father retired. While there, he worked for a few years for the Phoenix Cement Company in Clarkdale. He was then rehired again by Phelps Dodge, working as a welder in Morenci, AZ for 14 years. After ending his career, he returned to Jerome and took care of his mother for 15 years until



her death in 2000.

He is preceded in death by his parents and his sister Dorothy, a nephew, and a sister-in-law and brother-in-law. He is survived by three sisters, Mary Lou (George), Helen (Jack), Joan (Tim), a brother Frank and many nieces and nephews. He leaves behind his beloved cat, Einstein.

He was indeed loved by his family and friends. He was a true "Jeromite" - a native who spent his last years enjoying the climate, walking to town to check his mail, visiting with the locals, and talking with the tourists.

And a special thank you from the Vladich family to his friends and medical team who stayed close to him and gave him their unconditional love and support during his last years.
