

#### The 50th Annual Jerome Fire Department Auxiliary Halloween Dance

**Saturday, October 25th** marks the 50th year that the Jerome FD Auxiliary has hosted the Halloween Dance and fundraiser. The band will be the Naughty Bits; there will be a costume contest and lots of fun to have.

Doors will open at 7:00 with the band starting at 8:00 playing until 12:00AM. Please remember that this is an all-cash event and please drink responsibly (21 and older).

This year's event will be held at the basketball court near the sliding jail, as it was last year.

This annual dance is our largest fund-raising event for the year and typically accounts for 60 - 70% of our discretionary spending funds.

#### Jerome Fire Department has medical Equipment available to lend out.

Jerome Fire has medical assistance equipment including wheelchairs, crutches, canes, boot braces and more. Please contact the Fire Department if you or your family have need of these items. They are available to lend to locals, for those in need of them on a temporary basis, and to assist those who are unable to purchase these items.

## Ready, Set, Go!

Ready, Set, Go! is a nationwide program adopted by the 15 Arizona Sheriffs that educates residents about proactive measures to take before an emergency and actions to follow when communities are threatened.

The three steps encourage Arizonans to get READY by preparing now for what threatens their community, be SET by maintaining awareness of significant danger and to GO, evacuate immediately when the danger is current and lifethreatening.

#### **All-Hazard Evacuation Steps**

#### **READY - Prepare Now**

#### Be aware of the hazards that can threaten your community.

- Take steps now to prepare for seasonal threats.
- Register with your county/tribal emergency notification system.
- Connect with your local emergency management office, sheriff's office and public health department on social media.
- Make a family evacuation and communication plan that includes family phone numbers, out-of-town contacts and family meeting locations.
- Build an emergency go kit with enough food, water and necessary supplies for at least 72 hours. Include supplies to help keep you and your family healthy, such as face coverings, hand sanitizers and sanitizing wipes. Start with the five P's: people and pet supplies, prescriptions, papers, personal needs and priceless items.
- Check with your neighbors, family, friends and elders through video chats or phone calls to ensure they are READY. Keep up to date on local news, weather watches, weather warnings and public health recommendations

#### SET - Be Alert

#### Know that there is significant danger in your area.

- Residents should consider voluntarily relocating to a shelter or with family/friends outside the affected area. Residents should avoid close contact with those who are sick and should practice public health recommendations when relocating.
- Grab your emergency go kit.
- Keep in mind unique needs for your family or special equipment for pets and livestock.

Stay aware of the latest news and information from public safety and public health officials.

This might be the only notice you receive. Emergency services cannot guarantee they will be able to notify everyone if conditions rapidly deteriorate. Be SET to GO.

#### **GO! - Evacuate**

#### Danger in your area is imminent and life threatening.

- Residents should evacuate immediately to a shelter or with family/friends outside of the affected area. Residents should avoid close contact with those who are sick and should practice public health recommendations when relocating.
- If you choose to ignore this advisement, you must understand emergency services may not be able to assist you further. Follow instructions from emergency personnel, stay on designated evacuation routes and avoid closed areas.

#### **Town Siren**

The potential fire outlook is extreme as we had minimal moisture (Very weak monsoonal activity) through the months of June and July and now August. It has been identified that in a natural disaster event that early warning system is vital. We are very fortunate that we have a town siren that we can set off in the event of an incident where you need to be aware of what's going on around you. So, if you hear our siren going off for an extended amount of time, look out your doors and try to identify where the hazard is coming from. This system is designed to help with early evacuation in the event of an incident. With our community being so small we have limited resources to assist with all evacuations so be aware that you may have to self-evacuate.

The fire department has identified potential evacuation areas depending upon where the incident is and the potential travel of the hazard. The Jerome fire station is an evacuation center with heating, cooling and the potential for feeding the residential population. The 300-level parking lot and the Gold King baseball lot are also good potential evacuation areas.

You can go online to the town of Jerome's website to sign up to get emergency alerts and other notifications on your phone. Please use these tools to help us keep you safe.

#### 5 P's of Evacuation

- People and Pets and other animals/livestock and supplies.
- Prescriptions with dosages, medicines, medical equipment, vision and hearing aids, batteries and power cords, face coverings, hand sanitizer and sanitizing wipes.
- Papers including important documents (hard copies and/or electronic copies saved on external hard drives or thumb drives), insurance papers, contacts.
- Personal Needs include clothing, water, baby supplies, food, cash, credit cards, first aid kits, phones, and chargers. Items for people with access and/or functional needs, such as older adults and children.
- Priceless items include photos, irreplaceable mementos and other valuables.

Have you ever thought it might be fun to pretend you were a "Lady of the Night"?


