

Yavapai County is considering conducting a **Hazardous Household Waste Disposal Event** for Verde Valley towns. Each town would share proportionately in the cost based on the level of their residents' participation (proof of residency would be required), and it is estimated that Jerome's share would be around \$700. Items accepted would include cleaners, pesticides, acids, antifreeze, paint, paint remover, paint thinner, solvents, stains, fluorescents, pool chemicals, adhesives, fuels, household mercury and batteries. They would NOT accept anything commercial or from

a business, ammunition, asbestos, explosives, fireworks, medical waste, radioactive materials, tires, used oil, appliances, household trash, or anything in plastic bags. The event would take place in Camp Verde on a Saturday morning in the fall.

We would like to hear from you! Is this something you would like to see Jerome participate in? Are you likely to travel to Camp Verde to dispose of these items? Please let us know!

Save \$\$ on your prescription drugs ...

Did you know that free prescription discount cards are available to Jerome residents? Through our participation in this National League of Cities (NLC) program, Jerome residents have saved a total of \$639.46 (average savings 26.8%) since our participation began in May 2013. The program has no restrictions based on a resident's age, income level, or existing health coverage, and the card can be used at more than 60,000 participating retail pharmacies across the country. It helps residents who are completely uninsured, as well as residents who have insurance, but have specific medications that are not covered by their insurance. It can also be used for pet medications filled at participating pharmacies.

Residents can obtain a free NLC Prescription Discount Card in a number of ways. You can print them from the Internet at www.caremark.com/nlc, or you can pick up a card at Jerome Town Hall or the Town Library. Residents can also use www.caremark.com/nlc to locate the nearest participating pharmacy or call (888) 620-1749 for assistance with the program.

United Verde Soil Program in Clarkdale

The Town of Clarkdale has announced that Freeport Minerals Corporation (Freeport) has submitted an application with the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality's (ADEQ) Voluntary Remediation Program to undertake the United Verde Soil Program in Clarkdale. Clarkdale has scheduled a special Town Council meeting for Tuesday, May 19, 2015 at 6:00 p.m. During the meeting, the Council will hear a presentation from ADEQ about their Voluntary Remediation Program. In addition, Freeport will make a formal presentation about the United Verde Soil Program, which will include a discussion of the boundaries of the initial project area. The meeting will be held in the Clark Memorial Clubhouse, 19 N. 9th Street in Clarkdale, and the public is invited to attend the meeting.

Jerome Fire Department

Summertime is almost here, so now is a good time to evaluate your defensible space around your home. The Prescott National Forest office has predicted above average temperatures and continued drought conditions for an active wildland fire season.

The Fire Department offers site inspections for your defensible space. The Town slash burn site is available for you to dispose your weeds, brush and trees. Also, the Fire Department will be hosting a Paradise Tree workshop on Monday, June 22nd at 5 p.m. Learn how to properly control these trees. There are many herbicide products on the market, be careful and follow all directions on the label. Be cautious of home remedies as there are not regulated and may be more harmful than good. The following chapter of the IPMC is shown. This chapter deals with weeds, brush and tree control. We all live very close together and wildfire is a potential danger for all of us. Let's work on defensible space.

International Property Maintenance Code As Amended and Adopted by the Town of Jerome 9 July 2009

Section 302.4 – Weeds, bushes, trees and other vegetation. All exterior property areas shall be kept free from dry vegetation, tumbleweeds, weeds, bushes, tall grass and trees which present a visual blight upon the area, which may harbor insects or rodent infestations, or which is or may likely become a fire hazard or otherwise threaten the health and safety or the economic welfare

of adjacent property owners or occupants. It is the responsibility of the owner or occupants to cut or remove grass and weeds in excess of ten (10'') high throughout the property unless the Building Official, in consultation with the Fire Code Official or his designee, determines that it is not practical to do so on some or all of the property.

Section 302.4.1 Dangerous Trees. All exterior areas shall be kept clear of trees that may cause a danger. The following criterion shall apply:

- 1. Tree dead or near dead and is likely to fall.
- 2. Tree is overhanging a public or private way so as to be in the path of vehicles and/or pedestrians.
- 3. Tree has an infectious disease, parasites or insects.
- 4. Tree has become a danger to overhead electrical wiring.

The Fire Department is always looking for new members for fire or EMS or both. Free training, cool t-shirts, and drive big trucks with red lights. 5:00 PM, every Thursday. Come on down and see what we do. Everybody is welcome.

Why So Many Regulations?

Living in Jerome has its special gifts, such as the incredible views, the four seasons climate where no particular season will kill you, and of course to be a part of living history. However, living here also has its challenges and built-in obligations to each other, so that we can all live happily and safely. It is especially critical, due to the density of our housing and that fact that everyone is so close to their neighbors, that each property owner or renter give special attention to how their life-style and behavior affect each other.



Jerome has adopted a Property Maintenance Code which addresses such issues as unscreened storage of old tires, scrap material, non-running vehicles, vehicle parts and miscellaneous personal items. It also brings focus to the necessity for property owners and occupants to remove dry weeds and other combustible

plant materials as an effort to minimize fire danger. But the truth is, that if we each just do "the right thing" by our neighbors, and for that matter for ourselves, the need to enter into an enforcement effort is dramatically minimized.

We all know that parking is always an issue in our Town, and as I drive around Town, I see that there are many cases where if the parking areas along our streets were cleared of weeds and miscellaneous debris and storage, parking would be much easier, and in many cases, more parking spaces would likely be the result.

The value of eliminating unnecessary fire hazards is simple enough to understand, but there are other benefits gained by having a reasonably well maintained community; lower insurance rates, higher property and resale value, and of course at a very personal level, pride and peace of mind.

So both Fire Chief Rusty Blair and I ask you all to look around your property, do some spring cleaning and clear out the areas between your house and shed or garage, cut down and remove those weeds and old dead trees. If you need to find out where and when you can burn dry brush and tree limbs, call the Jerome Fire Department at 649-3034. For information about the Cottonwood Transfer Station to get rid of junk and debris, call 649-9733. If you need advice on what other options are available to screen or store personal items call me at 634-7943......then just sit back enjoy wonderful Jerome!


Greetings from the Jerome Chamber of Commerce


The JEROME BOOK 10th Edition

continuing myths of the Old West. He is best remembered for his short fiction featuring miners, gamblers, and other romantic figures of the California Gold Rush.


GHOST WALK October 9th & 10th
