TOWN ORDINANCE NO. 37

PROHIBITING THE KEEPING OF PLACES FOR SMOKING OPIUM

THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF JEROME DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Every person who opens or maintains to be resorted to by other persons, any place where opium or any of its preparations are sold, or given away, to be smoked at such place, and any person, who at such place, sells or gives away any opium or any of its preparations, there to be smoked or otherwise, used and every person who visits or resorts to any such place for the purpose of smoking opium, or its said preparations, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or by imprisonment in the city jail not exceeding six months or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 2. Any person renting, leasing, or using any house, room, apartment or other place as a resort for the purpose of indulging in the use of opium or any preparation containing opium or being the owner of such house, room or apartment, knowingly suffers it to be used for such purposes shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Marshall or his Deputy or persons acting in official capacity as such of said town, to seize and carefully keep all cups, pipe, apparatus, boxes and things used for the purpose of eating, smoking and inhaling opium and produce the same in court to be retained until the final disposition of any case in which said articles may be required as evidence to then be destroyed by order of the court.
