

TOWN ORDINANCE NO. 74

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE OBSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC STREETS AND ENTRANCES TO PUBLIC HALLS AND PUBLIC BUILDINGS, AND THE OBSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC STREETS BY MEETINGS AND PUBLIC SPEAKING, DEBATES OR DISCUSSIONS, WITHOUT A PERMIT FROM THE MAYOR.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Common Council of the town of Jerome, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to idly stand or sit in or upon any public street, alley, sidewalk, or cross-walk in the Town of Jerome, or to stand or sit in or upon any public street, alley sidewalk or crosswalk, so in any manner to hinder or obstruct the free passage therein of persons passing along the same or so as in any manner to annoy or molest persons passing along the same or to stand in or at the entrance of any church, hall, theater, or at the entrance of any church, hall, theatre, or place of public assembly so as in any way or manner to obstruct such entrance.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to obstruct any public street, alley, sidewalk or crosswalk in said Town by conducting or addressing any assemblage, meeting or gathering of persons or by making or delivering any public speech, lecture or discourse or by conducting or taking part in any public debate or discussion in or upon any public street or alley in said Town without first having obtained a permit in writing from the Town Marshall approving by the Common Council; or ad interim approved by the Mayor, with notice to the chairman of the license committee; which permit shall specify the time and particular place of such meeting or assemblage. It shall be within the discretion of the Mayor as to the granting or withholding of such permit.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding twenty-five dollars, (25.00), or by imprisonment in the Town Jail for a period not exceeding 25 days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its passage and posting as required by law.
