
As always, bring a dish to share. After our meal we will **announce the winners** of the Holiday Lights Contest!

We are very pleased that our firefighters will have some of the latest and greatest gear and equipment to help them do their job protecting our community while staying safe.

With the resignation of Ron Chilston, our Assistant Chief due to personal reasons, we have promoted Tim Irwin to Assistant Fire Chief while Jasper Lanning serves as Duty Officer/Wildland Captain and Ian Haney serves as our new Duty Officer. Both Jasper and Ian are now employed full-time by Jerome Fire while Tim Irwin serves in a non-paying position as

our new Assistant Fire Chief.

The 44th Annual Jerome Fire Department Auxiliary Halloween Dance Saturday, October 27th marked the 44th consecutive year that the Jerome FD Auxiliary has hosted the Halloween Dance and fundraiser. This annual dance is our largest fund-raising event for the year and typically accounts for 60-70% of our discretionary spending funds. This year's dance grossed \$15,179.00 while netting the Auxiliary \$11,009.17 after all expenses were accounted for. Thanks to everyone who attended and we will see you next year at the 45th Annual Halloween Dance!

Greetings Everyone and Happy Holidays!

Recent zoning activities, including updates to the Zoning Ordinance, are ongoing. A request for rezoning a block of property on the Hogback is under evaluation, citizens are bringing projects to improve properties, NACOG grants are funding home improvement projects, and a few new businesses have opened or are on the horizon. I'm excited to be involved with these activities and feel fortunate to have the opportunity to help with behind the scenes details, and work with the community.

The new temporary sign rules will soon be adopted to the Zoning Ordinance. In the past, temporary signs outside of businesses have been 'allowed' for 90 days in a calendar year. Going forward, temporary signs will be allowed for 45 days 3 times a year with permit on file. The change is a result of numerous temporary signs that have become permanent fixtures in the commercial zone.

Businesses are allowed two permanent signs, these are approved by the Design Review Board. Some buildings are on more than one street and may have a third permanent sign approved.

If you have questions about this, I'm available anytime to discuss it or visit your business.

This holiday season, whether you are a local resident or a business owner, I wish you all an excellent successful season with wonderful celebrations of your special holiday!



TREASURES IN THE OLD BOOKROOM

Jerome Public Library


Sitting in The Old Book Room the other day, a question came to mind; "Who is the best-selling author of all time?" Quick research showed there's a tie for this "title." William Shakespeare sits atop the list with approximately 2-4 billion copies of his poetry and plays sold. Right beside him with the same staggering number is Agatha Christie, known for her detective/mystery stories (Miss Marple and Hercule Poirot) and the world's longest running play, THE MOUSETRAP. In addition, she wrote a few romance novels under the name Mary Westmacott. A quick trip to the "M" (for Mystery) section and I counted in our vintage collection 26 of the 85 books Agatha Christie wrote.

Personally, I like to think she's the "champion" because it makes me agree with the Doctor. "Doctor Who?" you ask. "Yes," I reply. The long-running sci-fi series from the BBC, featuring a regenerative Time Lord who travels through time and space in a blue Police call box (it's bigger on the inside) had an episode that revolved around Agatha Christie (portrayed by Fenella Woolgar). At the conclusion, the Tenth Doctor

(David Tennant) shows his companion, Donna Noble (Catherine Tate) his copy of "Death in the Clouds," by Ms. Christie, calling her "the best-selling novelist of all time." The Doctor's book has a publishing date of the year 5,000,000,000! Well done, Agatha.
